Opinions include, but are not limited to: the White House, Congress, courts, government agencies, lobbying, and consulting firms, advocacy groups, media outlets, museums, think tanks, non-profit organizations, etc. - Gain valuable skills and hands-on work experience - Research solutions to foreign policy issues in a weekly seminar at the McCain Institute taught by a former U.S. ambassador - Visit government agencies, attend cultural events, and network with professionals from numerous fields 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - The Arizona Legislative and Government Internship Program (spring only) is a competitive university-wide program that provides an opportunity to intern full-time at a state agency, the Arizona State Legislature, the Governor’s Office, or the Arizona Supreme Court during the spring semester - Participants receive a tuition and fee waiver; - Additionally, receive a stipend of approximately \$5,000 - Earn 12 upper division credits

Click “Apply Now” on desired internship page - If the application isn’t open, select “Save to Favorites” and you’ll be alerted once it opens. - In addition to the application, upload an unofficial transcript, two recommendation forms (accessible via the Study Abroad application) from academic and/or professional references, and scans of your student and government issued IDs - Students will interview with a selection committee after applications are reviewed 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Visit ASU Handshake and search for “Arizona Legislative Internship” - Upload your completed program application, unofficial transcript, personal statement, resume, and two (2) current academic or professional letters of recommendation from either a work supervisor or professor. - Please do not include letters from colleagues, coworkers, family members or friends. If your recommenders do not want you to upload their letters, they can email them to Gisela.Grant@asu.edu - Students will interview with a selection committee after applications are reviewed
